### “The Southern Highlands Sustainability Hub” An exciting new Wingecarribee initiative



Guest speaker is **Tim Edwards**, Sustainability Manager, Building Products Innovation Council

An Australian by choice and Canadian by birth, Tim is an environmental consultant responsible for developing and maintaining the

Building Products Life Cycle Inventory. ## Hot weather burst finished off some Orchids, kick-started others.

After three weeks of cold weather, with the Sun Orchids sitting there refusing to open, suddenly in late October, we got a burst of hot weather (27.9 C max). Two things happened: the little pink *Caladenia* type things ("Finger Orchids") which had been flowering prolifically for 5 weeks in Kangaloon, nearly all shrivelled up; and in response to hot weather (which suits them) the Sun Orchids, Beard Orchids and Flying Duck Orchids all popped open.

So, it is a case of win some, lose some.

Firstly, the most prolific Sun Orchid which is found along Tourist Road - The Spotted Sun Orchid - *Thelymitra ixioides*.

As a matter of record, these are the very first of this species of Sun Orchid to open, in Kangaloon, on 24 October 2011. The same species was rampantly in flower in Nowra, on 28 August.

- Similar habitat - both are slashed grasslands on sandstone base soil.
- Different altitude - approx 60 metres in the Nowra case, and approximately 600 metres in the case of Kangaloon.
- Difference in flowering time: 7 weeks delayed flowering - owing to the altitude and cooler climate.

The next "new season" Orchids to open in the heat were these Leek Orchids. This is an as-yet unnamed species of *Prasophyllum*. The closest species is probably *Prasophyllum fuscum*, (but it has been determined not to be that species, by CSIRO experts, which means I can safely refer to this one as "*Prasophyllum* sp. aff. *fuscum*").

## Barren Grounds Wildflower Walk

In spite of a heavy downpour during the thunderstorm on Friday afternoon it had stopped raining by Saturday morning and 6 people met at the picnic area in Barren Grounds. We decided to take the track to the west past the stone lodge, and here we noted an *Acacia binervata* (Two-veined Hickory) in flower. This track starts out as open heath, merges into mallee and then low forest.

The widespread white heath flowers of *Epacris obtusifolia* (Blunt-leaf Heath) and *Epacris microphylla* (Coral Heath) provided a background for the other colourful flowers. We identified the dark pink *Boronia barkeriana* (Barker's Boronia), the lighter pink *Sprengelia incarnata* (Pink Swamp Heath) and *Bauera rubioides* (River Rose) while the purple *Sowerbaea juncea* (Vanilla Lily) was just coming into flower. Most delightful though was the beautiful blue of the many patches of

*Dampiera stricta* (Blue Dampiera) on both sides of the track and which seemed to be an even stronger blue than usual.

Two of our group were looking for fungi as well as flowers and they introduced us to some unusual fungi growing on old *Banksia* cones and on the gall on a *Leptospermum* bush. Because of the recent wet weather we also noticed many flourishing patches of moss as well as the Club Mosses *Selaginella* and *Lycopodium*. Two flowering plants we saw which are not always recognized as members of the Proteaceae were *Symphionema paludosum* (Swamp *Symphionema*) and *Conospermum ellipticum* (Smokebush).

Several mallees with lots of striking white flower clusters attracted the photographers as it is not usually so easy to get close enough to photograph eucalypt blossoms. One of these mallees had unfortunately been blown down by the recent high winds and so we had the opportunity to really see the flower clusters close up. The track down the slope to the stone bridge was a bit wet underfoot in places but it was here we saw big bushes of *Boronia thujona* full of flowers and some large pink flowered *Tetralochea* (Black-eyed Susan). Some Waratah plants were seen but none were in flower this year.

We sat on the rocks by the stream to eat our lunch but it was just as well we didn't need to cross over because the water was deep and flowing fast. After lunch we returned at a steady pace back to the cars.

We had noted more than 60 plants, some in flower, some not, and all agreed it had been an interesting day. Perhaps next year, with better weather, more will join the walk and suggestions for other different walking tracks are always welcome.
